# THE NATIONAL FLAG



**The National Flag**



- The flag of the Republic of Kazakhstan has a **gold sun** with 32 rays above a soaring golden steppe eagle, both centered on a sky blue background
- The hoist side displays a national ornamental pattern "koshkar-muiz" (**the horns of the ram**) in gold
- The **blue colour** is of religious significance to the Turkic peoples of the country, and so symbolizes cultural and ethnic unity
- It also represents the endless sky as well as water; the sun, a source of life and energy, exemplifies wealth and plenitude

- The **gold and blue** colours were inherited from the former Soviet flag which were the gold from the hammer and sickle and the blue bar from the bottom of the flag.
- The pattern represents the art and cultural traditions of the old khanate and the Kazakh people.
- The **sun** represents the source of life and energy. It is also a symbol of wealth and abundance; the sun's rays are like grain which is the basis of abundance and prosperity.
- People of different Kazakh tribes had the golden eagle on their flags for centuries.
- The **eagle** symbolizes the power of the state. For the modern nation of Kazakhstan the eagle is a **symbol of independence**.
